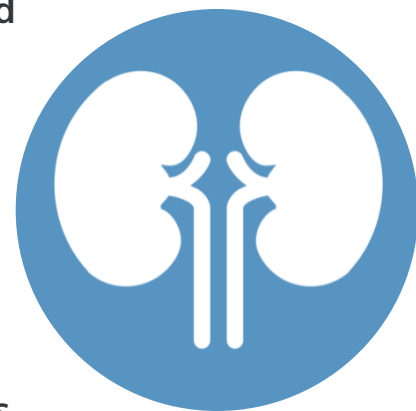


About the American Kidney Fund
